CHAPTER 2. GWANGJU, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA

2.1. Welcome to the Republic of Korea

The Republic of Korea is located in Northeast Asia with a population of approximately 5.2 million. Dating back to 2333 BC, Korea has a rich history, which includes the creation of Hangeul, the Korean alphabet. The language was introduced by then ruler, King Sejong the Great, in 1446. It is one of the few alphabets whose creator is known.

Today Korea's capital, Seoul, is a very populous metropolitan city and houses some of the world's largest corporations such as Samsung and Hyundai. Korea has the 12th largest economy in the world and has been a leader in highly sophisticated industries, including semiconductors, automobiles and IT.

2.2. Welcome to Gwangju

Gwangju is one of the oldest cities in the Korean peninsula and has grown to become the sixth largest city of the nation. The city sits on 193.53 square miles of land, and is home to approximately 1.5 million citizens. It is well-known for its spirit of citizenship, rich cuisine and arts.

Spirit of Citizenship

Gwangju citizens peacefully took to the streets against the martial law imposed by the military government on May 18, 1980. The demonstration became a scene of many crimes committed by the Korean military as citizens were beaten, fired upon and killed by troops. The citizens fought for democracy against the military for ten days from the 18th to the 27th of May. This historic uprising is now known as the May 18 Gwangju Democratic Uprising. The poignant memories have become the fabric of the city, and the archives of the movement were inscribed on the UNESCO Memory of the World Register in 2011.

The city was also a political stronghold for the late President Kim Dae-jung, who is the 2000 Nobel Peace Prize winner and the only Korean Nobel Prize recipient in history.

Rich Cuisine

In close proximity to the Yellow Sea, Gwangju is surrounded by mountains, rivers and rice paddy fields. This setting has provided the citizens with a wide variety of fresh local produce, seafood and beef. As a result, Gwangju is widely known as the city of Korean traditional dishes. The city is particularly famous for kimchi, a side dish that is present in every meal in Korea. Every October, it hosts the Gwangju World Kimchi Festival, where visitors can try many different kinds of kimchi and also make it themselves to take home. The popular tteok-galbi, or marinated beef patties, is another dish visitors should try in Gwangju. The local beef is well-known for its flavor, juiciness and tenderness.

Asia Culture Hub

Gwangju hosts two biennales: The Gwangju Biennale, started in 1995 and held every even year; and the Gwangju Design Biennale, started in 2005 and held every odd year. Through these international events, local artists as well as those from all around the world have the opportunity to interact with each other their ideas and work. The Asia Culture Center was created in our effort to make the city an artistic hub where artists can freely create, collaborate and develop their art.

CHAPTER 3. THE 18TH FINA WORLD MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS GWANGJU 2019

3.1. Registration

In order to participate at the 18th FINA World Masters Championships Gwangju 2019, online registration at General Management System (FINA GMS) must be completed.

The registration shall take place through the online FINA General Management System (FINA GMS). Registration will begin on Wednesday, January 23rd and end on Monday, June 24th 2019.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

1. Go to FINA GMS at <https://registration.fina.org>
2. Click "Create Account"
 - Select either "Masters Athlete", "Masters Coach" or "Masters Accompanying Person"
 - If you participated in the World Masters Championships in Kazan 2015 or Budapest 2017, you can log back in using your existing e-mail address and password.
3. Enter your personal data in your profile
4. Attach your color accreditation photo (please follow the photograph requirements)
5. Attach a scanned copy to the personal identification document you will use (if you require a visa, please submit a passport scan)
6. Select "FINA World Masters Championships 2019" in the Event Tab.
7. Indicate the disciplines in which you intend to compete
8. Pay the Participation Fee online*
9. Select the event in which you wish to participate once the participation fee is PAID
10. Pay the event fees online* (for details see 3.2 below)
 - * Please note that only VISA and Mastercard are accepted for payment

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Final registration and events entry deadline: Monday, June 24th, 2019 (23:59 UTC)
By this date, the following actions must have been completed:

- All persons wishing to participate must be registered, and have paid their registration fee for the event, by **Monday, June 24th, 2019**.
 - All individual and team event entries must be paid for by **Monday, June 24th, 2019**
 - Swimming entry time can be modified Until **Monday, June 24th, 2019**.
- * No Registrations or new event entries will be accepted after June 24th, 2019

PHOTOGRAPH REQUIREMENTS

A passport style photo must be supplied during the online registration and that will be used as part of the accreditation badge for access to venues at the Championships. In order for photographs to be uploaded into the system they must be in the *.jpeg (*.jpg) format, in color (not black and white), with a minimum image size resolution of 425 pixels wide by minimum 566 pixels high and a maximum size of 1Mb.

THE PHOTOGRAPHS MUST BE:

- taken against a plain white, light grey or light cream background (free from shadows).
- taken in full-face view directly facing the camera (chin and shoulders must be visible)
- with a neutral expression and the mouth closed (no grinning, frowning or raised eyebrows)
- taken with the eyes open, clearly visible and looking straight at the camera (with no sunglasses or tinted spectacles, and no hair across the eyes)
- in sharp focus and under good natural lighting
- free from reflection or glare on spectacles, the frames of which must not cover any part of the eyes.
- taken of the full head, without any covering unless worn for religious reasons (provided that the person is photographed likewise in his/her passport)
- of each person on their own (no objects, chair backs or other people visible)
- free from any editing to improve or alter the appearance in any way.
- taken no earlier than 6 months before the documents are submitted.
- originals only (copied or scanned photographs are NOT acceptable).

3.2. Fees and Entry Procedure

All participants are invited to pay all the fees through the FINA GMS at <https://registration.fina.org>. Once participants choose the discipline and the event, they must pay a fee in order to be approved. Visa and Mastercard are accepted. A participant receives an e-mail notification of the successful or unsuccessful payment.

FEES ARE DIVIDED INTO TWO CATEGORIES:

- Registration fee for athletes and accompanying persons
- Entry fee which is paid for each registration by event

All payments can be made through FINA GMS. (For credit card payments only VISA and Mastercard will be accepted. Email notifications will be sent out for all successful and unsuccessful payments.)

Only coaches and/or captains can register a team. For that, you must be registered as a coach or as an athlete with the additional function of coach/captain. That will allow you to access a specific team entry tab where you will be able to see the

members or your club and create a team. Finally you must pay the registration fee for a team.

Registration for Team, Relay and Synchronized Events (Swimming, Diving, Artistic Swimming, Water Polo)

Once a participant is registered, if he/she is nominated as a captain or coach, he/she is able to see the names of the other people who have registered from the same club. Then he/she can select those people in order to create a team to participate in an event. Once the team is complete, he/she must then pay the required fee and the entry is approved upon successful payment.

ONLY ONE PERSON MAY MAKE THE TEAM ENTRY.

REFUNDS

A refund will only be provided in the case where there are less than 3 (three) Water Polo teams in a bracket. You may not transfer any entry to another competitor nor one registration to another competitor.

3.3. Accreditation

In order to be accredited for the World Masters Championships as a participant, it is necessary to complete online registration through the FINA GMS at <https://registration.fina.org> and pay the fees by the registration deadline of June 24, 2019 (23:59 UTC).

Registration is mandatory for Athletes and Coaches. To get the accreditation for accompanying persons, it is necessary to pass online registration and make an online payment for the accompanying individual.

Once the person has registered for the 18th FINA World Masters Championships Gwangju 2019, they have to pay a Fee in order to be approved.

All participants should visit one of the Accreditation Centers (Nambu University Main Venue, or in the case of open water swimming, Yeosu Accreditation Center) upon arrival, undergo the accreditation procedure and receive their accreditation badges.

PASSPORT

All participants of the 18th FINA World Masters Championships Gwangju 2019 must carry a passport issued by a government agency or a travel document that is equivalent to a passport to enter the Republic of Korea.

* Passports must be valid at least six months beyond the dates of your trip.

- ※ If accepted by overseas diplomatic mission, payment is possible in the currency of the mission residency.
- ※ The documents submitted to Visa Navigator meets the minimum visa requirement for most countries.

For a more accurate visa screening, the head of the mission can request additional documents or waive documents to be submitted in consideration of the region of jurisdiction. The documents submitted through the visa navigator may differ from the visa application documents posted on the homepage of the different diplomatic missions (consular bulletin boards). Please prepare the required documents according to the diplomatic mission.

The 18th FINA World Masters Championships Gwangju 2019 will host 5 competitions: Swimming, Diving, Water Polo and Artistic Swimming in Gwangju City and Open Water Swimming in Yeosu City. Competitions will be held in the following venues.

Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center (SW, DV, WP)



As the main venue of the 18th FINA World Masters Championships Gwangju 2019, Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center will host Swimming, Diving and Water Polo competitions.

It was built for the Summer Universiade Gwangju 2015 and historic as the automatic water depth control equipment was used for the first time in Korea. This venue is one of the top facilities with the best water quality in Asia running on an automatic high-tech operation system.

Yeomju Gymnasium Artistic Swimming Venue (AS)



This indoor multipurpose gymnasium has been used to hold volleyball, basketball and handball games every year since its opening in 1987. We installed a temporary pool to transform the gymnasium into an artistic swimming venue.



WARM-UP PROCEDURES:

• Competition Pools

1) Swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious and controlled manner. No diving or backstroke starts will be allowed except in designated sprint lanes. One or more lanes shall be designated as ONE WAY SPRINT lanes during the pre-meet warm-up sessions in the competition pool only.

2) Pull-buoys, kick boards, fins, hand paddles and other training aids considered inappropriate are not allowed in the competition pool or warm-up pool, as well as watches and heavy jewelry.

3) Competition pools will be available for warm up/cool down pool for swimmers competing that day only.

- warm up/cool down time: 06:30-7:30 / after end of competitions-18:00

• Warm-up Pools

Same as competition pools except NO lanes will be designated as ONE WAY SPRINT LANES. There shall be no diving or backstroke starts in the warm up pools.

WARM UP PROCEDURES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. ANY SWIMMER WHO ACTS IN AN UNSPORTSMANLIKE OR UNSAFE MANNER WITHIN THE SWIMMING VENUE MAY BE CONSIDERED FOR APPROPRIATE ACTION OR PENALTY by the FINA Masters Commission.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS: A swimmer may enter a maximum of five (5) individual events, but not more than two (2) individual events per day. Swimmers may also enter the open water swimming event in addition to the five individual events. The time entered for an individual event must not exceed the qualifying time for that event.

A swimmer can be part of a maximum of one relay per each relay event

Entries without times will not be accepted. **No entries and time change are allowed after the entry deadline deadline of 24 June 2019 (23:59 UTC).**

QUALIFYING STANDARDS:

The times should be obtained during a sanctioned meet.

FINA suggests that the times should be obtained within two years of the Championships.

Please note that the actual time of the event swum, which has exceeded the qualifying standards, will not be shown on the result sheets, but instead will be noted on the result sheets as N.T. (No Time).

COMPETITION NOTES: All starts will be "over the head" i.e. swimmers from the previous race will stay in the water until the next race has started. The one-start rule will apply for all swimming events.

RECONFIRMATION: There may be reconfirmation of the following events, 800m free, 400IM and 400 free. The reconfirmation shall be done electronically. Details of this reconfirmation procedure or notification of such will be published on the website after the close of entries. The rest of the events will be seeded from the entries.

PRE-SEEDING: The 800m, and 400m Freestyle and 400m Individual Medley will be pre-seeded using the times entered, slowest to fastest regardless of age or age group. All other events will be pre-seeded using the times entered with the oldest age groups first and with the slowest heats swum first within each age group.

RELAY EVENTS: Relay sheets or cards indicating the names of the pre-registered swimmers will be given to the team representative on arrival at registration. These competitors must be verified or amended and given an entry time on the relay sheets or cards returned to the designated point. It is not possible to change the entered Age Group for a relay team after the deadline of the entries. Change of swimmers on a relay team is allowed up to 12:00 noon on the day before the relays. All relay team members must be affiliated with the same swimming club. A swimmer may not swim for more than one team per relay event.

MIXED RELAYS: “Mixed” means both sexes compete; i.e., two females and two males. The order of swimming is optional.

REPORTING: It is the responsibility of all swimmers to report to the clerk of the course (marshalling area) at least 15 minutes prior to their designated races.

RESULTS: All results will be posted on the Championships website after each event. Results sheets per event are available for purchase (an update on rates and location will follow).

MEDALS, INDIVIDUAL EVENTS: Medals will be awarded to 1st to 3rd places (gold, silver and bronze) in each age group and 4th to 6th places medals of lesser value.

MEDALS, RELAY EVENTS: 1st to 3rd places (gold, silver and bronze) in each age group (each member of the team will receive a medal.)

AGE DETERMINING DATE: The actual age of the competitor as of December 31st, 2019

AGE GROUPS: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94... (five-year age groups as high as necessary).

ENTRY INFORMATION:

Swimmers entering the Open Water Swimming must be familiar with the requirements that are needed to participate in an Open Water Swimming event and that they have made appropriate preparations for this event!

Open Water Swimming is limited for safety reasons to 1,000 swimmers per day. Entries will close when the 1,000 limit is obtained by age groups assigned each day.

RACE INFORMATION:

The Open Water Swimming competition will be held for three (3) days as follows:

Friday/August 9 2019/55-90+ age group
Saturday/August 10 2019/40-54 age group

It will be an in-water start.

MARSHALLING AREA: All athletes must report to the registration area two hours before their starting time. At the marshalling area all competitors shall be

in attendance 30 minutes before their allotted wave. A map showing the course will be clearly visible in this area for all the swimmers. Athletes will be called with a microphone system or megaphone, starting with the first wave.

SAFETY: Full medical provision and appropriate safety craft will be provided during and at the end of competition.

CHANGING AREA: Competitors must leave their equipment/clothes in the advised area. The Organizing Committee will provide a visible numbered coloured cap and timing chip for each swimmer. Each swimmer is required to wear this cap/chip all way throughout the race. A second cap may be worn under the brightly coloured numbered cap.

SUPPORT FACILITIES: Changing facilities will be available close to the start and the finish. A food and beverage area and a medical centre will be available on site.

MEDALS: Medals will be awarded to 1st to 3rd places (gold, silver and bronze) and 4th to 6th places medals of lesser value in each age group.

IMPORTANT: No one may smoke in any of the athlete's complexes or in the surrounding areas.

The competition and training schedules are subject to the weather and course conditions.

3.7.3. Diving

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT: 25 years

AGE DETERMINING DATE: The actual age of the competitor as of December 31st, 2019

AGE GROUPS:

· Springboard and platform: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80+ (five-year age groups as long as necessary).

· Synchronised diving: 50-99 and 100+ (age determined by adding the age of the two divers).

SCHEDULE: The programme will be made for six (6) days from August 13-18, 2019.

SAFETY: Divers must indicate that they are able to execute the dive. Officials may remove divers from an event where the divers' safety is a concern.

PRACTICE PROVISION:

The days of 11 and 12 of August are designated as practice days for diving prior to the first day of competition.

Open practicing time during the two practice days will be between 07:00-19:00. Practice times during competition days will be from 06:30 until 20 minutes prior to the start of the first competition. After last competition the pool will be available until 20:00.

Prior to the next event only those divers who will participate in that event can use the respective boards or platform. When there is no event the other divers can use the platform or boards.

Between each event, there will be a 20 minute practice time.

Restrictions for simultaneous dive from platform and springboard will apply.

TECHNICAL MEETING:

Technical meeting will be at 10:00 on August 12, 2019 at Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center.

COMPETITION DATES:

The competition will start on each August 13-18, 2019 competition day at 08:00 o'clock.

COMPETITION FORMAT: The divers can freely choose their dives from the table in FINA Diving Rules, providing each dive to be performed has a different dive number.

For age groups 50+, any dive from 10m must be with feet first entry and with a degree of difficulty of 2.0 maximum.

For age groups 70+, dives with the same dive number can be repeated if different positions are used.

In synchronised diving events two divers from different clubs within the same Federation are permitted to compete as a synchronised diving team in the 3m springboard and the platform synchronised diving competitions.

In Synchronised Diving both divers must perform the same dive number and position. Otherwise, the Referees shall declare a failed dive (0 points)

All divers will perform a full series of dives in their age group and there will be no preliminary or final contests. The Organising Committee reserves the right to run events concurrently, depending on the number of entries.

DIVE SHEETS:

The submission of Dive sheets will be communicated to each diver via the e-mail used in registration. FINA may in exceptional circumstances accept dive sheets at the venue not later than 24 hours prior to each event. In case of online filling organisers require to sign the original dive sheet by the diver.

Late sheets and changes to an existing sheet will incur a penalty fee of 10.00 USD per sheet between 24 hours and three (3) hours prior to the event.

No changes of diving forms will be accepted after the deadline of 3 hours before the start of the event.

REPORTING: All divers are responsible for being at the competition site for the start of their designated event.

MEDALS: Medals will be awarded to 1st to 3rd places (gold, silver and bronze) and 4th to 6th places medals of lesser value in each age group. If there are fewer than six divers in an age group, only the first three medals shall be awarded.

IMPORTANT: No one may smoke in any of the pool complexes or in the surrounding area.

3.7.4. Water Polo

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT: 30 years

AGE DETERMINING DATE: The actual age of the competitor as of December 31st, 2019

AGE GROUPS: 30+, 35+, 40+, 45+, 50+, 55+, 60+ ... (five-year increments as high as necessary)

Age groups apply for men and women teams.

The age of the youngest member of the team determines the age group of the team. There are no restrictions on the ages of players older than the youngest player on the team.

ENTRY INFORMATION: During the preliminary rounds when there are 17 or more teams entered some or all teams may play more than one game per day. The maximum number in each Age Group is 20 teams.

A club can enter only one team per age group.

Maximum Number of entry 60 teams.

COMPOSITION OF TEAMS: FINA Masters Water Polo (MWP) rules apply to this competition. Please ensure that the composition of a team complies with MWP 2.1.

A team may enter up to 15 players on their team entry form to participate in any game of this tournament (i.e. seven players and up to 8 reserves). It is not compulsory to name a substitute goalkeeper. A goalkeeper who has been replaced by a substitute may, if the player returns to the game, play in any position.

Women players may be members of a men's team.

A player may only represent one club in the competition and all players must be registered with the same club.

If less than three (3) teams are registered in an age group, they will be asked to compete in the next youngest age group while maintaining a separate ranking. Teams which do not accept this will have their team registration fee reimbursed. Team's players registered just for water polo championship will have their individual registration fee reimbursed as well.

TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES: Training opportunities will be available at the Championships pools:

1. Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center main swimming pool (50x26x3m)
2. Nambu University Football Field warm-up pool (25x25x2m)
3. Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center warm-up pool (50x 21x2m)

Date: August 3 2019, two (2) days prior to the start of the competition

Requests for training should be made by written request prior to arrival, or on arrival at the competitor registration desk for Water Polo.

Further training opportunities may be available during competition, depending on the number of entries received. These additional opportunities will be announced at the technical meeting.

TECHNICAL MEETING: Technical meeting for coaches and managers/team representatives will be held at 16:00 on August 4, 2019 at the meeting room in the venue.

The final composition of the team shall be confirmed at the Technical Meeting. The team will be composed ONLY by players who have been registered in the FINA GMS and paid the registration fees.

COMPETITION DATES: August 5-11, 2019

COMPETITION SCHEDULE: The schedule for the competition will be provided on the website as soon as possible following the draw.

COMPETITION FORMAT: The competition format will be determined according to the number of teams entered in an age group. The object will be to have each team play a minimum of four games and to determine the final placing as far down in each age group as feasible. The format may be round robin, or group play. In group play, there may be one or more preliminary rounds, followed by semi-final and final to determine final placing.

COMPETITION VENUES:

1. Nambu University Football Field competition pool (35x25x2m)
2. Nambu University Football Field competition pool (25x25x2m)
3. Nambu University Municipal Aquatics Center diving pool (25x33x2m)

EQUIPMENT: Teams will be responsible for providing their own practice and warm-up water polo balls. The Organising Committee will provide the competition match balls, which will be the official FINA Water Polo ball of Mikasa.

Game caps will be available, but teams may use their own caps, provided the numbers on the caps conform to FINA rule WP 4 and are 10cm in height. Note MWP 2.1 provides for a list of up to 15 players in masters water polo, all players listed on the final roster are eligible to play in the competition.

ENTRY PROCEDURE: To be eligible for the competition each water polo player must complete an individual registration and pay the individual registration fee and the team must pay the registration fee for a team.

A nominated coach, manager/team representative must submit the fully completed Team Sheet for entry into the competition. Changes on the Team Sheet are not allowed after the nominated coach, manager/team leader has reconfirmed the entries at the technical meeting on August 4, 2019.

REPORTING: It is the responsibility of each team to be ready to play at least 15 minutes prior to the designated starting time for their match. Teams arriving later than 5 minutes after the designated start time for their match will forfeit the match, with the match awarded to the opponent with a score of 5-0. In the event that a forfeit may benefit the team forfeiting in terms of advancement, the Management Committee of the competition reserves to make any adjustment in the reported score to correct this possibility.

MEDALS: Medals will be awarded to 1st to 3rd places in each age group (each player on the team and a coach will receive a medal).

IMPORTANT: No one may smoke in any of the pool complexes or in the surrounding area.



3.7.5. Artistic Swimming

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT: 25 years

AGE DETERMINING DATE: The actual age of the competitor as of December 31st, 2019

AGE GROUPS:

- SOLO: 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over
- DUET: 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over with age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- MIXED DUET: 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80 and over with age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- TEAM: 25-34, 35-49, 50-64, 65 and over with age group determined by the average age of the competitors.
- FREE COMBINATION: 25-39, 40-64, 65 and over with age group determined by the average age of the competitors.

TECHNICAL MEETING: Technical Meeting will be held at 14:00 on August 4, 2019 at the conference room in Yeomju Gymnasium.

The computer draw for the Technical Routines will be done after the close of entries and at least one month before the start of the competition.

PRACTICE PROVISION: On training days (3-4 of August) the warm-up pool (Yeomju Gymnasium) and competition pool (Yeomju Gymnasium) are available for practice. In the competition pool everybody has time for practice with music if the club has booked a date.

On competition days, there will be no practice with music, but time will be allocated for practice after the last event of the day and all day in half of the warm-up (Yeomju Gymnasium). Warm up and cool down will be available in half of the warm-up pool. The exact times of practice are subject to entry numbers.

POOL CHARACTERISTICS:

1. Yeomju Gymnasium warm-up pool (outdoor): 20mx15mx3m
2. Yeomju Gymnasium competition pool (indoor): 30mx20mx3m

SOUND EQUIPMENT: Competitors are responsible for their own music. Competitors/Team managers or Coaches can submit the music electronically via the Internet to the Organising Committee as per instructions published on the website. Each submission shall include the name of the competitor, the country and club name, event and music time. Music should be recorded so that the sound levels for soft, quiet and low-pitched music are clearly audible. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that they have appropriate copyright authorization. On the first day of the practice sessions, Competitors, Team Managers or Coaches shall be allowed to verify playback. If necessary, the Competitor/Team Manager or Coach may be allowed to change the music by presenting an acceptable reproduction to the Sound Center Manager. Music may be supplied in accordance to AS 15.3.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS: duet, mixed duet, team and free combination competitors must represent the same club. Each club may submit up to a maximum of five (5) routine entries per age group per event. Each club may enter one free combination in each age group. A competitor can take part in only one Duet, Team and Free Combination.

TEAM MEMBERS: Each team shall consist of a minimum of four (4) and a maximum of eight (8) members.

One half-point penalty will be deducted from the total final team score for each member less than eight (8).

Free combination shall consist of a minimum of four (4) members and a maximum of ten (10) members.

MAXIMUM TIME LIMITS: Time limits for technical routines and free routines including ten (10) seconds for the deck movement.

There is no minimum time limit.

There shall be an allowance of fifteen (15) seconds plus the allotted time for Technical Routines, Free Routines and Free Combination.

TECHNICAL ROUTINES: Technical routines must include all required elements as described in Appendix 1 of MSS rules. Music selection is optional and may be the same as the music used in the free routine.

Technical routines will be recorded (video) during the event and if necessary reviewed.

Video recording shall be in accordance to AS 14.1.9

OTHERS: Goggles may be worn.

Reserves Forms must be received at the designated point no later than 3 hours prior to the published start time of the event.

SCORING: Judging and scoring will be made in accordance to the AS Rules with the exception to BL 10.6.10.1: At the FINA World Masters Championships at least four (4) judges shall officiate in three panels. Judging shall be that as per the FINA Artistic Swimming Rules.

REPORTING: It is the responsibility of each competitor, including all members of duets, mixed duets and teams to report to the call room at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the designated event.

MEDALS: Medals will be awarded to 1st to 3rd places in all events in each group (each member of a duet, team/free combination will receive a medal including reserves) and 4th to 6th places medals of lesser value in all events in each age group.

If there are fewer than six routines in an age group, only the first three medals shall be awarded.

IMPORTANT: No one may smoke in any of the pool complexes or in the surrounding areas.

APPENDIX I

FINA REQUIRED ELEMENTS FOR MASTERS TECHNICAL ROUTINES

Supplementary elements may be added

1. Unless otherwise specified in the description of an element:
 - All figures or components thereof shall be executed according to the requirements described in this Appendix.
 - All elements shall be executed high and controlled in uniform motion with each section clearly defined.
2. Time limits as in MAS 4.1
3. Swim wear shall be black and the competitor shall wear a whitecap.

SOLO REQUIRED ELEMENTS

Elements 1 to 5 MUST be performed in the order listed.

Element 6 may be performed at any time during the routine.

1. **FISHTAIL** – from a Front Layout Position, a Front Pike Position is assumed; one leg is lifted to a Fishtail Position, the second leg is lifted to a Vertical Position (ending is optional).
2. **SPLIT POSITION** – followed by a walkout front or walkout back.
3. **SPINNING 180°** – From a Bent Knee Position, a Spin 180° is executed as the legs are joined to a Vertical Position at the ankles followed by submergence.
4. **TRAVELLING BALLET LEG COMBINATION** – Beginning in a Back Layout Position to include any 2 of the following positions– Bent Knee Back Layout, right; Bent Knee Back Layout, left; Ballet Leg, left; Ballet Leg, right; Flamingo Position, left; Flamingo Position, right; Ballet Leg Double.
5. **BARRACUDA BENT KNEE** – From the Back Pike Position with the legs perpendicular and the toes just below the surface, a Thrust is executed as one leg is drawn along the inside of the other extended leg to assume a Bent Knee Vertical Position. A Vertical Descent is executed in a Bent Knee Vertical Position at the same tempo as the Thrust

6. TWO (2) FORMS OF PROPULSION – Must include Egg Beater travelling sideways and/or forward (arms optional)

DUET REQUIRED ELEMENTS

Elements 1–5 MUST be performed in the order listed Elements 6–7 may be executed at any time during the routine

Routines for Duet 1 to 6 as above for Solo

7. JOINED ACTION – Where the swimmers are connected (touching) in some manner to perform on of the following:

- A connected figure or a connected float or connected stroking
- Action must be performed simultaneously. Mirror action is permitted.
- Stacks, lifts, platforms, throws are not permitted.

With the exception of the DECK WORK and ENTRY and as noted in the JOINED ACTION, all elements, required and supplementary, MUST be performed simultaneously and facing the same direction by both swimmers, Variation in propulsion and direction facing are permitted during pattern changes.

TEAM REQUIRED ELEMENTS

Elements 1–5 MUST be performed in the order listed Elements 6–9 may be executed at any time during the routine

Routines for Team 1 to 7 as above for Duet

8. CADENCE ACTION – Identical movements performed sequentially, one by one, by all team members. When more than one cadence action is performed, they must be consecutive and not separated by other optional or required elements. A second cadence action may begin before the first cadence action is completed by all team members but each team member must do the action of each cadence.

9. PATTERNS – must show a circle and straight line. Elements may be performed when in the circle or the straight-line patterns.

With the exception of the DECK WORK, ENTRY, CADENCE and as noted in the JOINED ACTION, all elements, required and supplementary, MUST be performed simultaneously and facing the same direction by all swimmers. Swimmers need not face the same direction in the circle pattern. Variation in propulsion and direction facing are permitted during pattern changes. Mirror actions are not permitted except in the description of the elements.

3.8. Victory Ceremonies

Victory ceremonies will be held in separate areas near the competition venues. Medals for places 4-6 are to be awarded at the same time. Three separate areas near competition venues will be designated for victory ceremonies. The detailed timeline of the awarding ceremonies will be available after the closing of the entries.

All diplomas are to be collected by athletes or the Heads of Teams at the competition venues.



5.4.1. Gwangju

Mudeungsan National Park (UNESCO World Geoparks)



Mudeungsan National Park was designated as a provincial park (May 22, 1972) and further designated as the national park number 21 on March 4, 2013. In 2018, Mudeungsan was selected as a UNESCO World Geological Park.

Mudeungsan has the implications as 'a mountain uncomparably high and large', 'a mountain unable to render a grade', and 'complete equality without a grade'.

Mudeungsan National Park spreads over Gwangju, Damyang, and Hwasun, covering 75.425 km² in total area. The highest peak rises 1,187 m above sea level. The park's scenic beauty is made famous by 61 naturally formed viewpoints, including columnar Joints, which are called Seoseokdae Rockface or Ipseokdae Rock Columns, with pentagonal and hexagonal pillar-shaped surfaces and oddly-shaped rocks. The park is also a natural habitat for 2,296 species of plants and animals, including eight endangered species, such as the Eurasian otter, Manchurian black water snake, leopard cat, and yellow-throated marten.

National 5.18 Democratic Cemetery



Four and a half kilometers from the east Gwangju tollgate of Honam (Jeolla provinces) Expressway, in the direction of Dam-yang, is National May 18 Democratic Cemetery, located in a nice location looking out over Mudeung Mountain. Within the gate of the cemetery is a sacred Memorial Monument standing tall. The shape of the monument is that of two hands holding an oval object. National May 18 Democratic Cemetery is the symbol of Gwangju, the city of justice and democracy, and is a sacred spot for democracy.

The National May 18 Democratic Cemetery is a symbolic space that reminds us of the May movement. Thus, the place is utilized as the place to boldly teach one important historical lesson that never would immorality or dictatorship be allowed to defile this land again. This cemetery also remains fervent in the minds of cosmopolitans who long for freedom, democracy and justice.

Exhibitions, performances, educational programs and festivals are available at five different venues: ACC Cultural Exchange, ACC Archive & Research, ACC Creation, ACC Children and ACC Theater. Visitors are free to enjoy diverse events year-round. The one-of-a-kind experience that ACC offers begins the moment one catches sight of the building. The gigantic venue that stretches for 16m² boasts a stunning presence. World-renowned architect and creator of ACC Kyu-sung Woo says that the goal was to create 'a masterpiece that embodies the spirit and natural landscape of Gwangju.' All the contemporary architecture is thus located below ground, leaving only light, trees and the vestiges of the May 18 democratic uprising such as the former provincial office of South Jeolla visible on the surface. Docent guides are provided for tours around the ACC to help visitors better appreciate the magnificent venue.

Yangnim-dong Modern History Culture Village



With various modern architectural buildings and a forest of trees over 100 years old, Yangnim-dong is a living museum of history, architecture, culture, and art. During the Japanese Occupation, the foreign missionary built churches, schools, and hospitals in Yangnim-dong; thus earning for the area nicknames like "Jerusalem of Gwangju" and "Occidental Village."

Early Christian relics and traditional Korean sites remain just as they were in the old days along narrow alleys; lining Minsok-gil are traditional hanok homes including the House of Choe Seung-hyo and the House of Yi Jang-u.

Gwangju-KIA Champions Field



In 2017, Kia Tigers became the champions of the Korean Series for the first time in 8 years, claiming its 11th trophy including victories made by its precursor, Haitai Tigers. The venue was previously the main stadium for the Gwangju Mudeung Stadium, but was demolished in 2011 and renovated into a baseball stadium in 2012. The stadium is 2 floors below and 5 floors above ground, and can accommodate up to 27,000 people. Having enjoyed rising popularity since the 2000s, baseball now rivals soccer as Korea's national sport. Kia fans are also on the rise, and whenever a match is held in their home stadium, the vast venue is filled with fans in red uniforms. Even for non-Kia fans, visiting the home stadium of a local team and enjoying a match with baseball enthusiasts will be a unique way to get to know Gwangju.

1913 Songjung station market



The Maeil Market in the alley opposite KTX Songjeong Station has been revived. Every store has a pretty handwritten signboard, and the sweet nostalgic scent of sugar-filled griddlecake, fish cake, and croquette linger in the air, with the sights of red ginseng yogurt, egg fried rice, and skewers with tasty morsels making visitors' mouths water.

If famished, you can devour 1,000-won noodles in broth at the noodle factory next to Tofu Village. The hottest-selling item in the alley is a calendar or a notebook marked with the Jeolla-do provincial dialect.

The Maeil Market has lived alongside Songjeong Station since 1913. Sharing over 100 years' history, the traditional market continues to thrive among commuters and travelers alike. Those days of shoppers taking home food ingredients and commodities wrapped in recycled paper have been gone since the 1990s when modern-day supermarkets took over Koreans' everyday life.

After a while, this market, too, suffered from the decline of traditional markets like other places, but its differentiated new strategy against big-brand supermarkets is to offer the precious heritage of the olden times from now on.

Traditional Culture Center



Located at the entrance of Jeungsimsa Temple at the edge of Mudeungsan Mountain, the Traditional Culture Center hides behind a low fence. Walk down the stairs and a beautiful building comes into view. The center boasts a stunning harmony of nature and urbanity, of tradition and modernity. Viewers can certainly go hiking on Mudeungsan Mountain, or opt for enjoying the serenity of enjoying the serenity of the mountain by sitting on the wooden floor of the Traditional Culture Center and listening to the sounds of wind and water.

The center offers programs and performances through which Korean masters and holders of Intangible Cultural Properties transmit traditional culture, such as Pansori, Gobeop, Gayageum, and Pyebaeksang Table for Korean weddings.

Visitors on their way down from Mudeungsan Mountain can stop by the Traditional Culture Center for the regular performances held every Saturday. With readily accessible Korean traditional culture through hands-on experience programs and creative events, the Traditional Culture Center can be enjoyable for families.

Gwangju National Museum



Built in the Korean traditional style, Gwangju National Museum has spacious exhibition halls and storage facilities spreading over four basement floors and two above ground, measuring a total of 3,305 m² in area. This is surrounded by a vast outdoor exhibition space-cum-garden.

Relics owned by the museum include the prehistoric relics found in Jeolla Province, Buddhist artworks, and artifacts from the Sinan shipwreck. It also includes ceramic works from kingdoms and dynasties, such as Baekje, Unified Silla, Goryeo, and Joseon. The first floor features the Calligraphy and Painting Hall, Special Exhibition Hall I and II, and Buddhist Art Hall; the second floor is home to the Prehistory Gallery, Ancient History Gallery, Goryeo Ceramics Hall, Joseon Ceramics Hall, and Sinan Shipwreck Artifacts Hall; and outdoors, visitors can find the Goryeo Blue Celadon Kiln Site, Dolmen, Stupa from Boansa Temple Site, Stone Pagoda from Jangundong, Gwangju, and more.

Royal Palaces



Since the 15th century, Seoul has been the capital city of South Korea. Visitors are presented with a variety of sites that will give them a glimpse of Korea's last kingdom, the Chosun Dynasty. One of the most popular places to visit are the royal Gyeongbokgung Palace, Changdeokgung Palace, Changgyeonggung Palace, and Deoksugung Palace, where kings of the Chosun dynasty lived for 500 years. Namsan Seoul Tower



Namsan Seoul Tower was the first tower-type tourism spot in Korea. The top of the tower is at almost 480m above sea level, including Namsan Mountain (243m) and the tower's own height (236.7m), making it one of the tallest towers in the Orient. It is comprised of Seoul Tower Plaza, recently opened to public access after 40 years, and N Seoul Tower, operated by CJ Foodville since 2005. The tower was first established as a broadcast tower to send out TV and radio signals in 1969. As of now, it has become one of the representative landmarks and multi-cultural venues in Seoul.

Gangwon Seoraksan National Park



Seoraksan National park was designated the 5th national park in Korea in 1970 and chosen as a nature preservation area on November 5, 1965. Also, internationally recognized for its rare species, Seoraksan is the area in Korea to have been designated as a Biosphere Preservation District by UNESCO in 1982, and in IUCN recognized its rich natural resources and labeled it category II (National Park). With its highest point, Daecheongbong Peak, located 1,708m above ground, Seoraksan Mountain is one of the most beautiful mountains in Korea, boasting a variety of colorful flowers in spring, refreshing clear water streams in summer, vibrant autumn foliage in fall, and a scenic snow-covered landscape in winter. With the mountain changing in color according to each season, a visit to Seoraksan Mountain guarantees a picturesque landscape any time of the year.

Yeosu Hyangiram



Hyangiram Temple, one of the four major Gwaneum temples, is at the end of the Dolsando Island. The Saint Wonhyo first built it and named it Wontongam Temple during the regime of the Queen Sundeok of Silla Dynasty. The Monk Yunpil changed its name to Geumoam Temple, and finally the Monk Inmuk was touched by the beautiful sunrise and renamed it as Hyangiram Temple in 1715 which was 41th year of King Sukjong regime.

There are not many places like Hyangiram for the sunrise. You can see not only the sunrise but also sunset from this place. If you stay on the rocky cost of the temple, you can see the sun setting beyond the horizon. And the sun comes back again in the next morning.

Suncheonman Bay Wetland Reserve




The fields in Suncheonman Bay are thickly covered with reeds taller than a full-grown man. It is the biggest colony of reeds in Korea. The image of the entire field swaying in the wind is as dazzling as waves on the sea.

The field of reeds is home to many plants that thrive in damp conditions, like the common reed and the starwort. Among the world's wetlands, Suncheonman Bay is widely known for attracting the largest number of rare birds.

Internationally rare birds such as the hooded crane, white-naped crane, white stork, black-faced spoonbill, Eurasian Oystercatcher, as well as birds designated as natural treasures, can be spotted here. There are about 140 species of birds including the snipe, wild duck, shelduck, and wild goose in total.

Suncheonman Bay National Garden



The Suncheon Bay Garden was established in order to turn 1.12 square kilometers of natural habitat into a conservation area, where it houses over 505 species of trees and 113 species of flowers. Especially, the numerous groups of tulips and royal azaleas are truly a sight to see. In addition, the nearby 30,000-square-meter field of canola flowers is in full bloom in May, which creates a beautiful yellow "wave" of color and trees make a great shades of canopy for the area.

Getting there is fairly easy as buses and an unmanned shuttle train (PRT) opened along with the Suncheon Bay Garden and Suncheon Literature Center district (4.64 km) are available for service. Visitors can hop on the PRT and go to the literature center, then also ride the train along the 1.2-kilometer stretch of reeds to Mujungyo Bridge.

Damyang Soswaewon



Soswaewon Garden is a private garden from the Joseon Period where the beauty of traditional Korea is preserved. It was built by Yang San-Bo (1503-1557) after he gave up his success when his mentor Jo Gwang-Jo (1482-1519) was killed during a political strife.

Soswaewon Garden presents itself as a clean and transparent garden where the righteous enjoy the life of anbinakdo (being comfortable amid poverty and taking pleasure in and honest life style) surrounded by a bamboo grove.

Including peach trees, various kinds of trees and grass are planted on both sides of the stream while clear water flows down the foot of the garden walls.

The log bridge above the valley adds to the charm of the scenery. The harmony between nature and the artificial waterfall is a sight to behold. Soswaewon Garden is 150m away from the main road. Passing through the thick bamboo forest, you will find the small valley and Soswaewon Garden on your left.

Gyeongju Bulguksa Temple [UNESCO World Heritage]



Bulguksa Temple is the representative relic of Gyeongju and was designated as a World Cultural Asset by UNESCO in 1995. The beauty of the temple itself and the artistic touch of the stone relics are known throughout the world.

Bulguksa Temple was built in 528 during the Silla Kingdom, in the 15th year of King Beop-Heung's reign (514-540). The temple was originally called 'Hwaeom Bulguksa Temple' or 'Beopryusa Temple' and was rebuilt by Kim Dae-Seong (700-774), who started rebuilding the temple in 751 during the reign of King Gyeong-Deok (742-765) and completed it in 774 during the reign of King Hye-Gong (765-780). Upon completion, the temple's name was changed to Bulguksa.

Even today, Bulguksa Temple is home to many important cultural relics such as Dabotap Pagoda (National Treasure No. 20), Seokgatap Pagoda (National Treasure No. 21), Yeonhwa-gyo & Chilbo-gyo Bridges (National Treasure No. 22), Cheongun-gyo & Baegun-gyo Bridges (National Treasure No. 23), Seokguram Grotto (National Treasure No. 24), the Golden Seated Vairocana Buddhist Figure (National Treasure No. 26), the Golden Seated Amita Figure (National Treasure No. 27), and Saritap Pagoda (Treasure No. 61).

Jeju Hallasan National Park



Hallasan Mountain rises up proudly from the center of Jeju Island and is perhaps the island's most memorable landmarks. Also called Mt. Yeongjusan, meaning "mountain high enough to pull the galaxy," Hallasan Mountain is widely known by scientists for its geological value. Designated as a national park in 1970, there are 368 parasitic volcanoes called Oreums (peaks) around the main mountain.

Hallasan Mountain is famous for its vertical ecosystem of plants that results from the varying temperatures along the mountainside. Over 1,800 kinds of plants and 4,000 species of animals (3,300 species of insects) have been identified; to explore the mountain's treasures, simply follow one of the well-developed mountain hiking trails.

Hallasan Mountain is relatively easy to hike. With hiking courses less than 10 km in length, it is possible to go to the peak and back in one day. However, the constantly changing weather brings a lot of wind, so make sure that you are well prepared before you start climbing.

5.5. Useful Information

CURRENCY

The official currency of the Republic of Korea is the Korean Won (KWN). The exchange rate (as of January 2019) for some of the major currencies is as follows:

1 US dollar (USD) = 1,140 won.

1 euro (EUR) = 1,310 won.

100 Japanese yen (JPY) = 1,050 won.

10 Chinese yuan (CNY) = 1,740 won.

Excluding some local markets and small shops, most stores and shops accept all major credit cards. Currency exchange is available at most banks. The Korean Won is subdivided into coins and paper bills.

BANK

Most banks are open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays and closed on weekends. Money can be withdrawn from ATMs with debit cards and credit cards at any time. Exchange rates differ by bank therefore it is recommended that you compare rates by visiting their website.

CREDIT CARDS

VISA and Master cards are accepted in banks, hotels, stores, shops and restaurants. Bus, train and airplane tickets can also be purchased with credit cards. Very few retailers and merchants accept traveler's check in South Korea.

ELECTRICITY

In South Korea the standard voltage is 220 V and the frequency is 60 Hz. You can use electric appliance in South Korea, if the standard voltage in your country is between 220-240V.

WATER

The tap water quality in Korea is 100% safe to drink and does not need to be boiled. Water coolers in public offices and banks are free.

INTERNET ACCESS

Free Wi-Fi service will be available at all venues and the Championships' Village. Most hotels and cafes will offer free Wi-Fi.
